About the course

The OHSU Department of Anesthesiology and Oregon Anesthesiology Group (OAG) have joined together to produce simulation-based CME and MOCA® (part IV) opportunities for practicing anesthesiologists. This course is in keeping with the American Board of Anesthesiology (ABA) Maintenance of Certification guidelines. The Doctors Company, one of the largest medical malpractice carriers, has offered credit to those who attend this course.

This day-long simulation-based course leverages crisis resource management principles to provide the participant with an enriched opportunity to experience common and uncommon critical events in anesthesia practice.
